Although a bachelor's degree is required, **no previous experience or coursework in education is necessary to apply**. Candidates must have a 3.0 GPA (or exceptional achievement elsewhere), be eligible for employment in Chicago Public Schools, and must not be certified to teach in any state. Fellows will

- Participate in an intensive paid summer training that will prepare them to be successful in urban classrooms
- Begin teaching full-time in the fall of 2008 while pursuing their permanent Illinois teacher certification at a local university
- Receive regular teachers' salary and full benefits
- Benefit from a streamlined application and selection process
- Join a movement of passionate, goal-oriented individuals who share a commitment to improving the educational opportunities for Chicago's school children
