

Fisher Fellowship Award for 2006-2007

Wade Hazel, Professor of Biology – (Fall) “Preparation of Research Results for Publication”

Abstract

I propose to use the released time provided by the Fisher Fellowship to write, and submit for publication, manuscripts that have resulted from research funded by a National Science Foundation (NSF) grant. The four year NSF research grant, for which I am the Project Director, ends August 31, 2006. Thus far, the grant has funded the summer research of over 25 students and seven faculty members. To date, the research has resulted in two publications, two additional papers in press, three faculty presentations at international/national meetings, three student presentations at international/national meetings, and three student presentations at regional meetings. Not including the research to be conducted next summer, an additional ten manuscripts and one review article resulting from the research is anticipated. The released time provided by the Fisher Fellowship will be used to write these manuscripts. I am well qualified for this project, with a consistent and strong record of publication. The likelihood of receiving funding from a subsequent grant, which I intend to submit, is directly related to the research productivity, as measured by publication quality and quantity, of the current grant. These future plans provide the professional development, context in which the Fisher Fellowship project proposed here should be considered.
