109th overall meeting; 71st for the Monon Bell



SERIES HISTORY

DePauw leads the all-time series, 50-49-9. Wabash won last year's meeting by a 27-21 count to snap DePauw's five-game win streak. The Little Giants' last win over DePauw in Crawfordsville came in 1994 in front of a nationwide audience on ESPN2 by a 28-24 score. Since the introduction of the Monon Bell in 1932, DePauw leads 34-30-6.

TELEVISION

The game is once again being televised live on WFYI-TV (Channel 20 in Indianapolis) throughout the state and to over 40 alumni gatherings across the country. Veteran sportscaster Jerry Baker is handling the play-by-play with former DePauw quarterback and 1982 graduate Rob Doyle and 1992 Wabash graduate Joe Emmick providing color commentary.

AT STAKE

Possession of the 300-pound Monon Bell goes to the winner.

COACHES

DePauw's Nick Mourouzis is in his 22nd season with the Tigers and his teams have posted a 133-81-4 record. Mourouzis, the winningest coach in DePauw history, ranks 12th among active Division III coaches in victories and 44th in winning percentage among active coaches with at least five years of head coaching experience. Only six coaches with at least 20 years as a head coach have a higher winning percentage. Mourouzis was named the SCAC Coach of the Year in 2000 after leading the Tigers to a three-way share of their first SCAC title.

Wabash's Chris Creighton is 17-2 in two seasons with the Little Giants and is 49-9 in six seasons as a collegiate head coach. He has led Wabash to its first North Coast Athletic Conference championship and the school's first postseason appearance since it finished second in 1977. Creighton coached at NAIA Ottawa (Kan.) University where his teams compiled a 32-7 record and earned conference championships each year. As a player, the 1991 Kenyon College graduate quarterbacked the Lords to their only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was the conference's MVP.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Tigers are the only team with two losses to have both of those defeats come to undefeated teams. DePauw dropped a 31-21 decision to Hanover on September 21 and a 42-33 contest to Trinity on September 28.

QUOTING COACH MOUROUZIS on Wabash

They are a very experienced ball club with very fine personnel on both sides of the ball. They're led by an outstanding quarterback in Jake Knott who is a four-year starter and has three years under his belt in the Bell game. In addition to that they have an experienced line and very good set of receivers as well as a strong rushing attack.

Defensively, they are also very experienced in their front eight. Nate Boulais is a leader for them on that side of the ball. They have great execution on defense which is why they haven't given up much yardage. Wabash is obviously clicking on all phases as they've won every game this year and their last seven a year ago.

on DePauw:

We have had a lot of success in moving the ball against quality competition this year. Andy Yoder has been connecting with the best group of receivers we've had here and our two backs have been running very well and displaying great quickness. I am really pleased with the progress Andy has shown. He has a great arm and is very accurate. Our offensive line has improved throughout the season.

Dan Ryan is having a great year with teams double and triple-teaming him. John Stephens is finally back to his old self after an early season injury. Each has led us well in the captain's role.

I don't think our defense is given due credit as they've held opponents to 77 rushing yards per game against strong competition. Our front seven have done a great job against the run forcing teams to put the ball in the air against us. Captains Charles Stanback and John Christophersen have provided excellent leadership this season.

In the first half of last Saturday's game we had three serious injuries to starters, but their subs stepped up and held Rose-Hulman to just 39 yards of offense and one first down against a team that was averaging 345 yards per game.

Players and coaches are always motivated for this game and I remind our club that it comes down to execution and we can't have six turnovers like last year. We were fortunate to come back and tie them. It always comes down to team that makes the fewest mistakes.

HOW CLOSE?

With DePauw holding just a one-game lead in the series, it stands to reason that any way it's broken down the rivalry is one of the most evenly-matched in college football. Home field advantage seems to mean very little as DePauw holds just a 26-24-3 advantage in games played in Greencastle and Wabash leads 23-22-5 in games played in Crawfordsville. Five games have been contested in Indianapolis with, appropriately, each winning twice and the other ending in a tie.

THROW OUT THE RECORDS?

The age-old adage in rivalry games is that you can throw out the records. Dating back to 1925, when Wabash has entered the game with the better record they have posted a 23-17-6 record. When DePauw has had the better record they totaled a 19-11 mark. Overall, the team with the better record is 42-28-6 for a .592 winning percentage.

WIN STREAK AT FIVE

The Tigers current five-game win streak is their longest since they won six straight to end the 2000 campaign and one to open the 2001 season. The five straight victories by double-digit margins is their longest such streak since 1990 when they won seven in a row by 10 or more points.

TIGERS TOUGH IN THE RED ZONE

DePauw's offense has been solid in the red zone as they've scored 27 touchdowns and two field goals in the 36 possessions in the zone. Of those 27 touchdowns, 16 have come on the ground and 11 in the air for a total of 191 points. Tiger opponents have converted 25 of 38 opportunities for 162 points including 22 touchdowns.

ANOTHER STREAK EXTENDED

The Tigers have scored in double figures in 34 straight games which is the longest such string in school history. They have also scored 21 or more points in 15 consecutive contests which also is the longest such streak in school history. DePauw's last single-digit point total came in a 9-6 overtime loss at Chicago in 1999. Their last game of fewer than 21 points was a 52-18 loss at Trinity last year.

WINNING SEASON

The Tigers have assured themselves of their 15th winning season in coach Nick Mourouzis' 22 seasons and their 18th .500 or better campaign in those 22 years.

RYAN GOING AFTER MORE RECORDS

Dan Ryan enters today's game needing just one more touchdown to break the school record for career touchdowns. He is currently

tied with Johnathon Stigall (1995-98) with 41. Ryan also needs 14 more receptions to break the DePauw career mark of 195 held by Jay True (1977-80) and 71 receiving yards to top the DePauw single-season record of 991 set by John Stephens last season. Ryan also holds the all-NCAA divisions record for career touchdown receptions in the state of Indiana.

BIG PLAY OFFENSE

Of the Tigers' 22 passing touchdowns, 11 have been for 28 or more yards. Of Dan Ryan's 15 touchdown receptions, seven have gone for 28 or more yards. Three of Jamarcus Shephard's five scores have been of 36 yards or more.

SMART TIGERS

Five Tigers have been nominated for Verizon Academic All-America honors. They include captains John Stephens and John Christophersen as well as Micah Lukens, John Roth and Jeremy Legge. To be eligible, student-athletes must be at least a sophomore, a starter or key reserve and possess a 3.20 cumulative grade point average or higher. John Stephens and Micah Lukens were named to the third team in District V.

TIGERS TOUGH DOWN THE STRETCH

Including the 1996 season, the Tigers have won 15 of their 16 games played in November including a 9-0 mark on the road. The lone loss in that string was last year's 27-21 loss to Wabash on the game's last play. Since the beginning of the 1996 season, DePauw teams are 38-5 in the months of October and November and are 19-3 on the road in that string. Over the last seven seasons, DePauw teams have posted a 29-5 record over the last half of each season.

SPOILING THE PERFECT SEASON?

Since 1980, Wabash has entered the Monon Bell game with a perfect record four times and in three of those instances, DePauw has spoiled the perfection. In 1980, Wabash entered with an 8-0 mark and the Tigers tied them 22-22 in Crawfordsville. The following season in Greencastle, Coach Mourouzis' first at DePauw, the Tigers won 21-14 to finish second-ranked Wabash's season with an 8-1 mark. In 1982, Wabash entered with a 9-0 record and beat DePauw 31-6 in Crawfordsville to complete their last unbeaten campaign. In 1998, Wabash entered with a 9-0 record only to have DePauw win 42-7 in Crawfordsville.

WABASH TIES

Quarterback Andy Yoder's grandfather, Bob Hepler, lettered at Wabash in 1949, 50, 51 and his great uncle, Bill Hepler, lettered in 1961, 62, 63. Yoder's uncle, Kent Yoder, lettered on the 1977 team that finished second in the nation as well as the 1978 squad. Junior running back Jackson Rust's father David, is a Wabash graduate. Wabash's Jake Knott was the holder for DePauw kicker Ben Murray while both were at Lafayette Jefferson H.S.

FIRST MONON GAME AT QB

In each of the last two games at Wabash, DePauw's quarterback has been a first-time starter in the rivalry. Kurt Hare started the 1998 game and Jason Lee did so in 2000.

DEPAUW TEAM NOTES

The Tigers have outscored opponents 75-28 in the first quarter and have scored on their first possession in four of the nine games this season ... They need 31 points to break the single-season record of 330 set in 1982.

MORE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Jamarcus Shephard leads the team with a 30.2 yard average on his eight kick-off returns, but hasn't had a return since the Chicago game ... Shephard has caught at least one pass in each game this season and has topped the 100-yard mark three times with a high of 206 yards against Trin-

ity ... **Dan Ryan** has caught a pass in 33 straight games dating back to his freshman season, while **John Stephens** has caught at least one in his last 29 contests ... Charles Stanback has recorded at least one sack in five of the last six games including three against Centre ... **Matt King's** 1,289 career rushing yards ranks ninth in DePauw history ... Starting left tackle, junior John Roth, earned his first collegiate start in last year's Monon game at left guard.
