The following list represents a selection of the many prestigious—and very competitive!—awards for which DePauw students and recent graduates may apply. You are encouraged to **meet with DePauw advisors** listed in the handout to discuss scholarship criteria and the application process.

- A Google search will take you to individual scholarship or foundation websites where you will find application forms, up-to-date information, and deadlines. Be sure to **read the website thoroughly** so that you can judge whether your experience and credentials make you a good fit for a particular scholarship.
- Most, but not all, of the opportunities on this list require applicants to be U.S. citizens. International students are encouraged to consult a list of scholarships and awards open to non-U.S. citizens. This list is available on the Graduate Fellowships website: www.depauw.edu/univ/graduate/
- Note that the deadlines below are those set by foundations for receipt of final application materials. DePauw sets **internal deadlines** well before final deadlines; please consult with advisors about these important dates.

Undergraduate

Apply prior to senior year.

Boren Scholarships, funded by the National Security Education Program (NSEP), support study abroad in world regions critical to U.S. interests. Open to U.S. citizens.

DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Scholarships support 4 to 10 months of study, thesis research, or an internship in Germany for sophomores or juniors in any academic field. DAAD also funds shorter summer course grants and a summer internship in Berlin for U.S. students interested in communication and journalism. Language skills should be commensurate with the student's study and research needs. Open to U.S. and Canadian citizens or permanent residents and foreign nationals.

DAAD/RISE Scholarships fund summer internships at German universities and top research institutions in the fields of biology, chemistry, physics, earth sciences and engineering. Knowledge of German language is not required. Open to applicants from the U.S., U.K., and Canada.

Elie Wiesel Prize in Ethics Essay Contest challenges college juniors and seniors to analyze urgent ethical issues confronting them today. Students must be nominated by a faculty member. Open to all applicants.

Gilman Scholarships reduce barriers to study abroad by providing financial assistance to students who are supported in college by a Federal Pell Grant. (If you have questions about whether your aid package includes a Pell Grant, please consult with the Financial Aid Office.) Open to U.S. citizens.

Goldwater Scholarships support rising juniors and seniors who plan to pursue a career in scientific research. Students are invited to apply in the sophomore and junior year. Open to U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals.

Hollings Scholarships offer a funding and a paid 10-week summer internship to students interested in oceanic and atmospheric science. Students apply as sophomores. Open to U.S. citizens.

Truman Scholarships supports graduate study for about 60 students across the US who have outstanding leadership potential and who are committed to careers in public service. Students apply as juniors. Open to U.S. citizens.

Udall Scholarships fund 1) rising juniors and seniors majoring in areas associated with environmental public policy, and 2) Native Americans and Alaskan natives intending careers in health care or tribal policy. Open to U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. permanent residents.

Graduate

Apply as a senior or recent graduate.

Carnegie Endowment for International Peace Junior Fellowships provide substantive work experience for students with serious career interest in, and exceptional background preparation for, international affairs. A very strong academic record is required. Applicants must be US citizens.

DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Graduate Scholarships fund a wide range of independent research projects and graduate study at German universities. Open to U.S. and Canadian citizens or permanent residents and foreign nationals who have studied at an accredited U.S. or Canadian university for at least two years by the time of application.

Davies-Jackson Scholarship funds up to 2 U.S. students for graduate study at St. John's College, Cambridge in the arts, humanities, or social sciences. Applicants must be "first generation" college students.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program offers approximately 1500 scholarships for one year of study, research, or English language teaching in over 155 countries worldwide. Open to U.S. citizens.

Gates Cambridge Scholarships support graduate study at the University of Cambridge for future leaders in global problems related to health, technology, and learning. Students apply to a specific program of study at Cambridge as well as to the Gates Foundation. Open to citizens of any country outside the United Kingdom.

Deadline: October 15, 2009 (U.S. citizens); December 15, 2009 (non-U.S. citizens)

Javits Fellowships support graduate study leading to a PhD or MFA in selected fields of the arts, humanities, and social sciences. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or U.S. nationals.

The Japanese Exchange and Teaching (JET) Programme is aimed at promoting grass-roots international exchange between Japan and other nations. Participants are placed with local government organizations throughout Japan and most often serve as assistant language teachers. Open to all.

Madison Fellowships fund graduate study for students who are committed to teaching American history, American government, and/or social studies full time in grades 7-12. Open to U.S. citizens or U.S. nationals.

Marshall Scholarships are tenable at any British University for 2 years of graduate study. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.7 or better, must have a compelling reason for wanting to study in England, and must be intellectually distinguished future leaders. Open to US citizens.

Mitchell Scholarships fund one year of graduate study in Ireland or Northern Ireland. Only 12 Mitchell Scholarships are awarded each year; other funding opportunities may also be available for students interested in graduate study in Ireland. Open to US citizens.

National Science Foundation (NSF) Graduate Research Fellowships support 3 years of graduate study leading to research-based masters or doctoral degrees. Open to U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. permanent resident aliens.

National Institutes of Health (NIH) Intramural Research Training Award (IRTA) provides opportunities for recent college graduates to spend a year engaged in biomedical research at the NIH. Open to U.S. citizens and permanent residents.

Deadline: 3-6 months prior to start date. Advisors: Sharon Crary (scrary@depauw.edu),

NIH-Oxford/Cambridge Scholarship is an accelerated, individualized training program for outstanding science students committed to biomedical research. Students work towards a D.Phil or PhD from either Oxford or Cambridge or may pursue a combined MD/PhD. Open to U.S. citizens and permanent residents.

Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarships fund formal study abroad, both short-term intensive language study and 1 to 3 years of academic or degree-oriented study. The deadline is in early April of the year before the award starts: students should apply in the spring of the junior year in order to go abroad during the fall after graduation. Open to U.S. citizens. Non-U.S. citizens may apply through the Rotary in their home country.

Deadline: early April *a full year or more before the desired start date*

Rhodes Scholarships are tenable for 1 to 3 years of study at the University of Oxford. Candidates must demonstrate intellectual excellence, depth and breadth of knowledge, intellectual curiosity, and a strong extracurricular record indicating a desire to serve and ability to lead. 32 awards are made annually to U.S. citizens.

Soros Fellowships fund up to two years of graduate study in any professional field or scholarly discipline. The applicant must be a "new American": a resident alien with a green card, a naturalized U.S. citizen, or the child of two naturalized citizens. Seniors and graduate students in first or second year may apply.
