

What to do when you arrive

- » **FIRST STATION: Residence hall check-in** – Students living in Bishop Roberts, College Street, Hogate, Humbert or Longden halls should check in at Humbert Hall in the South Quad. Students living in Lucy Rowland Hall should check in at Reese Hall in the North Quad.
 - Get your room key and student ID.
 - Complete housing check-in.
 - Pick up a schedule for the day and check your advising meeting location.
 - Pick up your parking permit, if you registered online prior to Aug. 22. To get a permit on or after move-in day, take your vehicle registration and student ID to the Office of Public Safety, 101 E. Seminary St., lower level.
- » **SECOND STATION: Your room**
 - Meet your roommate and your First-Year Resident Assistant (FYRA).
- » **THIRD STATION: Tent on the Green – Bowman Park** (Opens at 10 a.m. and closes at 3 p.m.)
 - Visit the Tent on the Green with any questions.
 - Learn about services offered by DePauw Health and PNC Bank.

Registering for Your Classes

The first stage of building a class schedule for the fall semester was requesting a first-year seminar. Your seminar has been assigned and is available in your portal on e-Services.

The rest of your fall semester class schedule will be determined during course registration soon after you arrive on campus in August. With guidance from faculty advisers, you will rank 10-15 courses from a list of courses that are appropriate for first-year students. The remainder of your fall schedule will usually be filled by courses from this list.

You may find it helpful to explore the courses available by visiting this website: depauw.edu/studentlife/firstyear/academic-life/courses-for-first-year-students. After reading the course descriptions, make an informal list of courses that sound interesting to you. Keep in mind that a variety of courses from multiple areas will provide balance between your existing academic interests and exploration of new topics or approaches. It will help you fulfill graduation requirements, too.

Full-time DePauw students may take between 3.0 and 4.5 course credits each semester. A typical course is 1.0 course credit, and a typical semester load is 4.0 course credits. One of these courses will be your first-year seminar, which counts as 1.0 course credit. Students in the School of Music, Management Fellows and Media Fellows will be pre-enrolled in required courses for their degree or program.



Complete Writing Assessment

All incoming first-year students need to complete a Writing Assessment by Aug. 5. Your assessment will not be graded or used for placement, but rather will be used to help you and the DePauw faculty develop the best practices for improving your writing skills. Please look at this assessment as a serious, but fun challenge. See the checklist in your portal for more details and a link to the assessment.

Making Healthy Choices

Students are expected to complete the Making Healthy Choices Modules that include information about alcohol and drug awareness, sexual assault awareness and DePauw's community standards process. Beginning Aug. 6, this course can be accessed through mydepauw.edu. Students should complete the course by Aug. 17.

Orientation Meal Information

Student meal plans are activated on Saturday, Aug. 22. A number of meals are arranged as part of the orientation program. The cost of the catered meals (Saturday dinner, Sunday brunch and dinner) will be deducted from your meal plan. Bon Appetit dining facilities are available for meals at other times.

All new students are expected to meet with their faculty advisor and mentor groups for dinner at 5:30 p.m. on Saturday. Dinner will be located in your first-year seminar meeting room for orientation, which is noted in your portal in e-Services. Locations will also be posted in each residence hall, at check-in, at the Tent on the Green and are available on the First-Year Experience website.

Students will also eat with their mentor groups for lunch and dinner on Sunday.

opportunities to provide a transformative four years that will prepare you exceptionally well


to live lives of purpose and accomplishment. Your full engagement with the opportunities
