*At DePauw, we are actively creating a culture of care. During your time here, you will be expected to do more than simply care; you will be expected to do something to better your environment. If one of your peers tells a hurtful joke, expresses feelings of self-harm or is in a dangerous or potentially violent situation, will you know what to do? Bystander intervention is an important component to creating a caring, healthy and safe community. You and other new students will explore what it means to successfully intervene. Following an introductory presentation, you will meet in small groups to discuss intervention strategies. Your mentor will tell you where your group will meet.*
