

Recital Program Style Guide

- Please use a standard font (Times New Roman or Arial, 12 point font)
- Please use the tab key to align information. Do not use the space bar.
- Below are examples of a program submission. Highlighted items indicate information you must enter. Other information, such as keystroke (tab, return) should not be entered.

All programs should include the following:

Performer's Name and Instrument (i.e. "DePauw Orchestra" or "Joe Smith, flute")

Accompanied by Accompanist Name (if necessary)

Concert Title (i.e. "A Walk in the Park" or "A Senior Recital")

Date

Time

Location (i.e. "Judson and Joyce Green Center for the Performing Arts, Thompson Recital Hall")

For multi-movement pieces, please enter the information as follows:

(1900-1990)

If a composer is still alive, list only the birth date:

(b. 1963)

If the exact birth or death date is not known, enter the most accurate information as follows:
