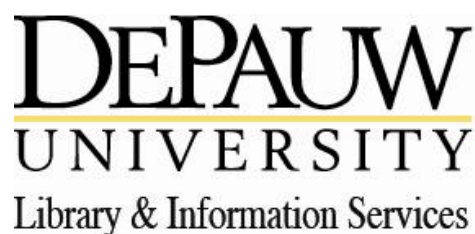

DePauw University is a private, liberal arts institution located in Greencastle, IN. The University's libraries primarily serve our students, faculty members and staff members, but members of the public are also welcome to use many of the resources at our libraries. Our collections support college-level education and research in the arts, humanities, sciences, and social sciences.

Borrowing from the DePauw University Libraries

To obtain a DePauw University Community Borrower's Card you must be at least 16 years of age and have either:

- a valid Putnam County Public Library card *and* a valid driver's license or state-issued photo ID.
 - There is a \$10.00 processing fee.
 - If the borrower is under the age of 18, a parent or guardian must sign our lending agreement, *in person*.
- *or*, a current student or employee ID from any other college, seminary or university in Indiana.

Applications are available at all of the DePauw library circulation desks and at the ID/OneCard Office in the lower level of the Union Building, where the cards are issued.

Once you have been issued a Community Borrower's Card for our libraries, you may:

- borrow books, government documents & maps
- check out up to 10 items at a time
- keep items 28 days

Not all items may be checked out, but all materials may be used in the libraries. For example, you may watch a video in the building, but may not check it out to take home. In the event of high demand for materials and/or equipment, we will give priority to student and faculty users and may deny usage to community users. For specifics, please visit

Community Borrower's Card holders are not eligible to:

- utilize computer lab facilities or to borrow limited resources such as laptops, lockers, reference books, study rooms, or videos.
- request Interlibrary Loan of materials from other libraries. To request materials from another library, consult your public or school library.
- access the libraries' electronic subscription databases from off campus. Database licenses

allow visitors' use only from within the libraries. Indiana residents have free access to an array of databases at www.in.gov/library/inspire/

Computers in the DePauw University Libraries are primarily for the use of DePauw University students, faculty members and staff members. Although computer lab facilities in the libraries are not open to the public, members of the public are welcome to use the computers in the reference areas of each library to meet specific information and research needs, such as:

- to access U.S. federal government information
- to conduct college level or other advanced research
- to access DePauw University's subscription databases

We do not have the resources to meet the general computing needs of the community. If you need to use a computer for e-mail, web-browsing, word processing, or activities other than academic or government library research, we encourage you to visit your local public library.
