

The following are a few of the nationally competitive scholarships available for undergraduate and graduate study in the sciences. There are many more, but this list includes those which for DePauw has some specific resources to help you apply. ### Undergraduate

- Goldwater - Supports 1-2 years of undergraduate study for students who intend careers in mathematics, natural sciences, or engineering; scholars apply in sophomore or junior year.
- National Security Internship - Undergraduate summer and one-year internships in fields such as cyber security and nuclear technology. See also Pacific Northwest National Laboratory internships for majors in chemistry, physics, and computer science.
- Udall - One-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$5,000 for students who intend careers related to the environment.
- Hollings - Offers generous financial support for the junior and senior years and a paid 10-week summer internship to undergraduates interested in oceanic and atmospheric science.
- DAAD/RISE - Offers a wide range of graduate and undergraduate scholarships and grants for study and research in Germany.
- EPA-GRO – Undergraduate Scholarship with a guaranteed summer internship at one of EPA's research facilities

### Graduate

- Fulbright - Supports one academic year of study/research in any of over 155 countries, with the goal of promoting cross-cultural interaction and mutual understanding.
- Marshall - Supports 2 years of study in any discipline at a university in the U.K., leading to the award of a British University degree. Highly competitive.
- Rhodes - Supports 2 or 3 years of study at Oxford University. Goal is to bring together outstanding students from many countries around the world and to prepare students for service to others. Highly competitive.
- DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) - Offers a wide range of graduate and undergraduate scholarships and grants for study and research in Germany.
- NSF Graduate Fellowship - The Graduate Research Fellowship provides three years of support for graduate study leading to a research-based masters or doctoral degree and is intended for students who are at the early stages of their graduate study. Intended for basic research problems.
- NIH - Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (NRSA) Institutional Research Training Grants (T32) – designed for support of clinical or medical research by Ph.D. students. Other pots of money for various NIH research goals including research by medical students are also available.
- NIH - Oxford/Cambridge - An accelerated, individualized doctoral training program for outstanding science students committed to biomedical research. The projects culminate in the award of a D.Phil or Ph.D. in science from either Oxford or Cambridge. Students may also pursue combined M.D./Ph.D. training through partnerships the program maintains with a broad range of American medical schools.
- Truman - Supports 1 or more years of graduate study in U.S. or abroad for students planning a career in public service; scholars apply and are accepted as juniors.
- Soros - Supports up to two years of graduate study in any professional field or scholarly discipline; applicants must be "new Americans" -- resident alien with green card, naturalized U.S. citizen, child of two naturalized citizens. Seniors and graduate students in first or second year may apply.
