In order to be permitted to re-enter the United States you must secure a signature on page three of your form I-20 or DS-2019. Please complete this form and submit it to CIEE at least one week in advance of your trip to assure that someone will be available to sign for you. We will verify all of your information, and sign the existing form I-20 or DS-2019. If necessary we will prepare a new immigration document for you to revalidate an expired Visa. The signed document should be ready for you to pick up within several days. To make sure that your form has been signed call CIEE at 765.658.4355

CIEE advises all students planning to travel outside the United States to carry extra documents for presentation to USCIS/State Department officials.

You should carry:

- Your I-20/DS-2019 - page three must be signed by the international advisor
- Your passport, bearing the valid F-1 Visa or J-1 Visa
- A current bank statement proving financial sponsorship
- A copy of your registration form confirming enrollment for the upcoming semester (a copy from e-services will suffice)
- A letter from the international student advisor confirming that you are in valid immigration status with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.
