Determining the Purpose

- 1. Determine the general purpose—to inform, to persuade, to entertain
- 2. Determine the specific purpose. This specific purpose needs to be sharp and focused. What is it you hope to accomplish?

For example, if the topic was hot-air balloons, is this a good specific purpose: "To inform my audience about hot-air balloons"?

Questions you need to ask about your specific purpose statement:

- A. Does it meet the assignment?
- B. Can I'do it in the time given?
- C. Is it relevant to the audience?
- D. Is it too silly for the audience?
- E. Is it too technical for the audience?
- 3. Determine the central idea. This is a concise statement of what you expect to say.

Topic: Computers

General purpose: to inform

Specific purpose: to inform the audience of the major factors to consider when buying a notebook computer.

Central Idea: The major factors to consider when buying a notebook computer are price, speed, screen quality, and special features.
