This I Believe

The "This I Believe" (TIB) program will be part of our reunion fun on Thursday, June 8. This session is based on the popular 1950's radio series of the same name hosted by Edward R. Murrow. It has taken on new life on National Public Radio, and is designed to engage our classmates in writing and sharing essays, describing the core values that guide their daily lives.

We invite you to contribute to this project by submitting your own statement of personal belief. A few of you will then be asked to present your submission to the rest of our class during Alumni Reunion Weekend.

To guide you through this writing process, we offer the following suggestions: Tell a story about you: Be specific. Take your belief out of the ether and ground it in the events of your life. Consider moments when belief was formed, tested or changed. Think of your own experience, work, and family, and tell of the things you know that no one else does. Your story can be heartwarming or gut-wrenching – it can even be funny – and it should be real. Make sure your essay ties to the essence of your daily life philosophy and the shaping of your beliefs.

Be brief: Your statement should be between 600 and 700 words. Your 50th reunion programming committee believes this endeavor will greatly enrich our reunion experience.
