

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS & PRIVACY ACT (FERPA) STUDENT CONSENT TO RELEASE FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of a student's education records. Education records include student account and financial aid records which are considered confidential and will not be released without written consent from the student. In accordance with FERPA, it is necessary for the Financial Aid Office to obtain written consent from the student in order to release any financial aid or student account information to a third party.
