

## Global French Studies Placement Test Scores Rev 5/17/2023

Compare the computer placement test score you have received with the courses listed below. Your score will tell you which Global French Studies (FREN) course you should take. If you receive a score just below the one required for the next higher level, the Global French Studies Program (FREN) will allow you to choose to move up one level. However, ***you may not*** register for a course that is below the one corresponding to your placement test score.

### Important:

- Students at DePauw are required to complete two language courses (in the same language), regardless of placement. The guide below indicates your “starting point” for FREN courses at DePauw.
- Students whose first language is not English may be certified as meeting this requirement through the Office of the Registrar, and in consultation with the director of English for Academic Purposes.

Students who place into the 200- or 300-level of FREN courses and who then take the FREN course recommended and earn a C or better receive additional (retroactive) credits as shown:

<u>SCORE</u>	<u>PLACEMENT</u>	<u>POSSIBLE ADDITIONAL CREDIT</u> (less any AP credit already given)
<b>440+</b>	<b>FREN 300-level</b>	2 credits (representing two FREN 200-level courses)
<b>355-439</b>	<b>FREN 200-level</b>	1 credit (representing one FREN 200-level course )

*\*\*\*If French is the language you normally speak at home, you may NOT register for a FREN 200-level course. You may begin with any FREN 300-level course.\*\*\**

<b>275-354</b>	<b>FREN 200-level</b>	(none)
<b>200-274</b>	<b>FREN 110</b>	(none)
<b>0-199</b>	<b>FREN 101</b>	(none)

*\*\*\* FREN 101 is not open to students with more than two years of French in high school (grades 9-12). With a placement test score of 0-274, these students must begin with FREN 110 (Review of Elementary French). No additional credit is given.\*\*\**
