## EMISON GALLERIES

The Emison Building serves as home for the DePauw Office of Admission and also displays curated exhibitions from the permanent art collection. The Shidzuo Iikubo '23 Gallery of Asian Art is dedicated to highlighting Japanese and Tibetan artworks from the University's collection. The adjacent gallery features a student-curated exhibition that highlights historic and contemporary African art.
