Small Business Cohorts Coming Soon

In collaboration with the West Central Indiana Small Business Development Center, small business owners and entrepreneurs in the Greencastle area can now access personalized support through a cohort-based program. Ecosystem Navigator Jared Ell has developed two collaborative models designed to provide essential resources and guidance for both established business leaders seeking additional support and aspiring new business owners.

The programs aim to equip participants with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to grow or launch their businesses. Cohort members will meet collectively and can access one-on-one support as needed throughout the program. Additionally, participants may apply for grants through the Growing Green and Gold Together Business Accelerator Program.

New Business Cohort

This program is designed to guide you through the essentials of starting and sustaining a successful business. You'll learn how to create a lean business model canvas, conduct market research, and successfully launch your venture. The cohort will also cover branding, building a strong social media presence, expanding your customer base, and properly registering your business. Throughout the program, you'll have access to valuable resources to help you achieve your goals.

Existing Business Cohort

This program is centered on expanding each member's existing business. You'll begin by assessing your business's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. From you'll there. engage in targeted programming designed to enhance these areas. Through these cohorts, you'll receive valuable feedback from fellow business owners, helping you refine your processes and drive growth.









Small Business Grants

Administered by Main Street Greencastle in collaboration with DePauw University's Growing Green and Gold Together Initiative.

Purpose

Main Street Greencastle and the Green & Gold Business Accelerator Fund supports small business development in downtown Greencastle, helping to revitalize the local economy, reduce storefront vacancies, increase employment, increase access to capital, and encourage entrepreneurship.

Eligibility

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a new or existing small business operating (or planning to operate) in downtown Greencastle. Downtown Greencastle is determined by the footprint of Main Street Greencastle.
- Have a business plan demonstrating viability and growth potential.
- Participate in business development training through the cohort-based programs delivered by Main Street Greencastle, the Growing Green and Gold Together Initiative, and the West Central Indiana Small Business Development Center.

Funding Priorities

Preference will be given to businesses that:

- Address community needs by filling gaps in the downtown business landscape.
- Promote innovation and sustainability in business practices.
- Contribute to a thriving, inclusive, and diverse business ecosystem.
- Offer internship or employment opportunities to DePauw students.
