A graduate of DePauw University and the Indiana University School of Law in 1980, he is active in a number of business, civic, and charitable organizations and a member of the Indianapolis, Indiana, and American Bar Associations.

Lauren earned her bachelor's degree, cum laude in communications from DePauw University, where she was also a Management Fellow. She received her juris doctor from the Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law. Lauren joined Ice Miller in 2011. She is active in politics, the legal community, with her alma mater, and the arts.

Lauren previously served as the senior policy director and legislative director for then-Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels. During her five years as advisor to the governor, she focused on issues relating to Medicaid, SNAP, TANF, and various other matters ranging from child welfare issues, public health, and insurance regulation. Lauren also helped lead a state team tasked with analyzing and implementing Indiana's response to the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

Further, Lauren served as the governor's chief lobbyist, successfully coordinating a legislative agenda that included a balanced budget without a tax increase, transparencies in local government, historic charter school and voucher reforms, economic development legislation, and redistricting.

Lauren's prior experience also includes serving as the strategic initiatives program director at the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration, where she assisted in the creation, development, and implementation of the Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP)—the nation's first consumer-driven health plan in the history of Medicaid. HIP is now a national model and has been replicated in multiple states. She also spent two years in private practice in the areas of health law and labor and employment law.

Lacey is a native of Logansport, Indiana, and a graduate of DePauw University. In 2016, she received her law degree from IU McKinney School of Law and a Master of Public Affairs from IUPUI's School of Public and Environmental Affairs. During her time in law and graduate school, she interned for the Indianapolis Airport Authority, Governor Mike Pence, and Ice Miller. In 2015, she served as the Indiana Senate's Borst Fellow, where she focused on fiscal policy and helped craft Indiana's biennial budget.

John served as a key aide to former Indiana Governor Robert D. Orr during his time as lieutenant governor, as well as serving as a deputy campaign manager for Orr's gubernatorial run in 1979 and heading up his transition team in 1980.

He was senior executive assistant for Legislative Affairs and Education Policy in the Orr administration, serving as chief legislative liaison for six general sessions and three special sessions of the Indiana Legislature during the 1980s. Since leaving state government in 1988, he has led the governmental and public affairs programs for several major Indiana firms.
