S-CAPE - Spanish Placement Test Scores Rev. 8/12/19

Compare the computer placement test score you have received with the courses listed below. This will indicate which Hispanic Studies course should be taken. Since no test is perfect, if the score received is just below the one required for the next level, the Hispanic Studies Program will generally permit students to move up one level, but students will **not** be permitted to register for a course below the one corresponding to their placement test score.

Important:

- Students at DePauw are required to complete two language courses (in the same language), regardless of placement. The guide below indicates your starting point for HISP courses at DePauw.
- Students whose first language is not English may be certified as meeting this requirement through the Office of the Registrar, and in consultation with the director of English for Academic Purposes.

Students who place into the 200- or 300-level of HISP courses and who then take the HISP course recommended and earn a C or better receive additional (retroactive) credits as shown. Retroactive credits do not count toward the language requirement.
